### Session 2

#### MEET

1. Who are your neighbors—in your family, your faith community, and in everyday life?
2. Did Andrea’s teaching spark an idea for a “food formula” you could develop to help you focus more on people than prep?
3. Where could you invite people to gather? Your home? The playground? The coffee shop?
4. What adjustments could you make to nail down a time on the calendar, ideally weekly, to make hosting routine?
5. What did you learn about why God wants us in community, and why the table is a picture of God’s love?
6. How can you move from “entertaining as performance” to “entertaining as people”?
7. What personal obstacles need to be overcome for you to practice hospitality?

1. In a few sentences – how would you describe who God is to someone who doesn’t know God or even believe there is a God?

2. Can you identify and share some of your talents that can be used for kingdom building?

3. Name a few practical steps you can take today to aid you in enlarging the kingdom of God?  
*“And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.”*
